	<i>Welcome to Members</i> Ms. Jones welcomed new members, Ms. Siu from New Asia College Student Union and Professor Cheung from Faculty of Social Science, to the meeting. She also introduced Ms. Sintra Tsang, the University Archivist who attended the meeting as an observer as part of her induction.	
LUG43/1	<i>Confirmation of Minutes</i> The minutes of the 42nd meeting were confirmed without amendment.	
LUG43/2	<i>Matters Arising</i>	
LUG43/2/1	<u>Open Forum on the move of the Philosophy Collection to United College Library (Re: LUG 42/2/1)</u> Ms. Jones reported that no further comment was received after the last meeting. The collection location criteria options and relevant information will be included in the Library's Collection Development Policy available on the Library website.	
LUG43/2/2	<u>Self Pick Up Hold (Re: LUG 42/7/1)</u> Ms. Jones thanked members' for their advice in the previous LUG meeting. Changes have now been made to the self-pick up hold slips, which now show the last 4-digits of library card number only, enhancing users' privacy.	
LUG43/3	<i>Library Strategy</i>	
LUG43/3/1	<u>JULAC Shared Integrated Library System (Re: LUG 42/3/3)</u> Ms. Jones reported than an evaluation exercised has been completed for the ILS tender and the result will be announced in due course once the tender procedure has been completed. The new system is targeted to go live in Summer 2017. Further information will be provided as soon as possible.	
LUG43/3/2	<u>JULAC shared Information Literacy multimedia courseware project (Re: LUG 42/3/4)</u> Ms. Jones explained that the UGC –funded project is a three year collaborative project including all of eight UGC funded libraries to create online training material to improve students' information literacy. She thanked CUHK Social Science students for participating in the user behavior interviews. The next project deliverable is a training session for liaison librarians in mid-January.	
LUG43/3/3	<u>University Archivist</u> Members welcomed Ms. Sintra Tsang, the first University Archivist in CUHK. Ms. Tsang introduced her role in preserving CUHK historical	

	records. Records management will be developed to better preserve historical and archival records.	
LUG43/4	<i>Library Collection</i>	
LUG43/4/1	<u>Report on Book Fund 2015/16 (Re: LUG 42/4/1)</u> Mr. Leung reported on the book fund balance and the dates of fund pooling. Ms. Jones added that the new library system offered a reading list module. There was discussion on whether or not finding material on reading lists was an issue, and the general feeling amongst the student representatives was that it was not a significant problem.	
LUG43/4/2	<u>RAC Bid for One-off Purchase of Electronic Resources</u> The Library's HK\$8.385 million bid was approved by RAC for the one-off purchase of e-book and e-journal collections. It has strengthened the Library's collection.	
LUG43/4/3	<u>Significant Acquisitions and Donation (Re: LUG 42/4/2)</u> Ms. Lau briefed members on the recent significant acquisitions of print and e-resources as well as the donations received.	
LUG43/4/4	<u>Proposed Collection Moves</u> Ms. Jones tabled the proposed move of library collections in different libraries for consultation. The Music collections would be consolidated with all music material, regardless of format in Chung Chi Library as requested by the department. The remaining AV collection would be moved from United College Library to the relevant subject library, with the films being in the University Library. Chinese and other East Asian Language and Literature would be consolidated in New Asia. Mr. Hung asked if the Philosophy collection could be moved back to New Asia. Ms. Jones said that the Library had been investigating further options but at the moment it does not look possible to move Philosophy back to New Asia. Mr. Hung was also concerned about the availability of media players and equipment needed if the AV collection moved to UL. The Library reassured Mr. Hung that equipment would move with the collections. Ms. Lau explained that a long-term aim is that AV materials would be switched to the latest available format. Ms. Jones added that an Open Forum would be organized soon and welcomed any comments about the proposals.	
LUG43/4/5	<u>Update on Digital Initiatives (Re LUG 42/4/5)</u> Dr. Lam reported the digitization of the Chinese Medicine rare books was completed and the digitization of Pian collection was in progress. She demonstrated the open-access digital repository to the members. Dr. Lam also updated members about the progress of AIMS (Academic	

	Information Management System). Professor Nelson asked if AIMS could help the faculty in checking copyright permission for their publications. Dr. Lam responded that the Library could provide assistance if needed.	
LUG43/4/6	<p><u>CUHK Golden Jubilee Celestial Civilian Scholarship (HK Literature) Award 2015</u></p> <p>Ms. Lau reported that the scholarship aims to encourage and recognize the excellence of research, analysis, and writing by the students of CUHK in the use of primary sources and rare materials held by the HK Literature Collection.</p> <p>This year the scholarship was awarded to Ms. Xi Yiyang, a PhD student from the Department of Cultural and Religious Studies.</p>	
LUG43/4/7	<p><u>Preservation of United College's Oracle Bones</u></p> <p>Ms. Lau reported that the Library invited Dr. Li Zongkun 李宗焜 from Academia Sinica, to visit the Library from November 30 – December 7, 2015. Dr. Li had examined the condition of the Oracle Bones in the Library and gave advice on their preservation. He also conducted two talks, one for United College and the other at the University Library for CUHK students and staff.</p>	
LUG43/4/8	<p><u>Universities Service Centre for China Studies (USC) Proposal</u></p> <p>Ms. Jones reported that the Library has been developing links with USC. A joint bid is going to RAC for two projects: to include the USC materials in the Library catalogue and to digitize their Mainland historical provincial and local newspapers.</p>

LUG43/6/1	<u>Digital Scholarship Lab</u> Dr. Lam updated members on the progress of the Digital Scholarship Lab, which will be launched in March 2016. Professor Nelson suggested more open-source software to be included in this lab.	
LUG43/6/2	<u>Self-service at the University Library</u> Ms. Jones had discussed with the architect about members' suggestion on moving the counter near to the staff office. However, the suggestion was not an option after the discussion. More details of the plan will be available on the Library website soon.	
LUG43/6/3	<u>New Asia Library Survey Results</u> Ms. Jones tabled the New Asia Library survey results and noted that the renovation was well received by the users.	
LUG43/6/4	<u>United College Library</u> Ms. Jones talked through proposed renovation of the United College Library renovation, including integrating the basement into the library during the day and opening up the ground floor to offer a learning cluster, group study rooms, larger windows and an extended lobby area. Mr. Hung asked if the UC Library would be opened 24-hour. Ms. Jones responded that the UC Library basement would become in effect a 24-hour zone for the users. Professor Nelson expressed concern about the opportunity costs, and preservation of original building. Ms. Jones responded that funding would be sought through a bid to Minor Works or an AA& I bid, and Campus Development Office (CDO) would take into consideration the building preservation issues.

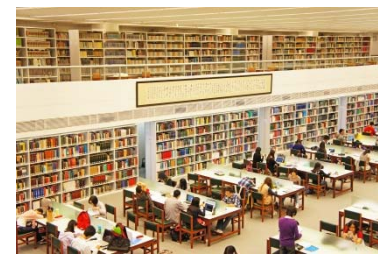

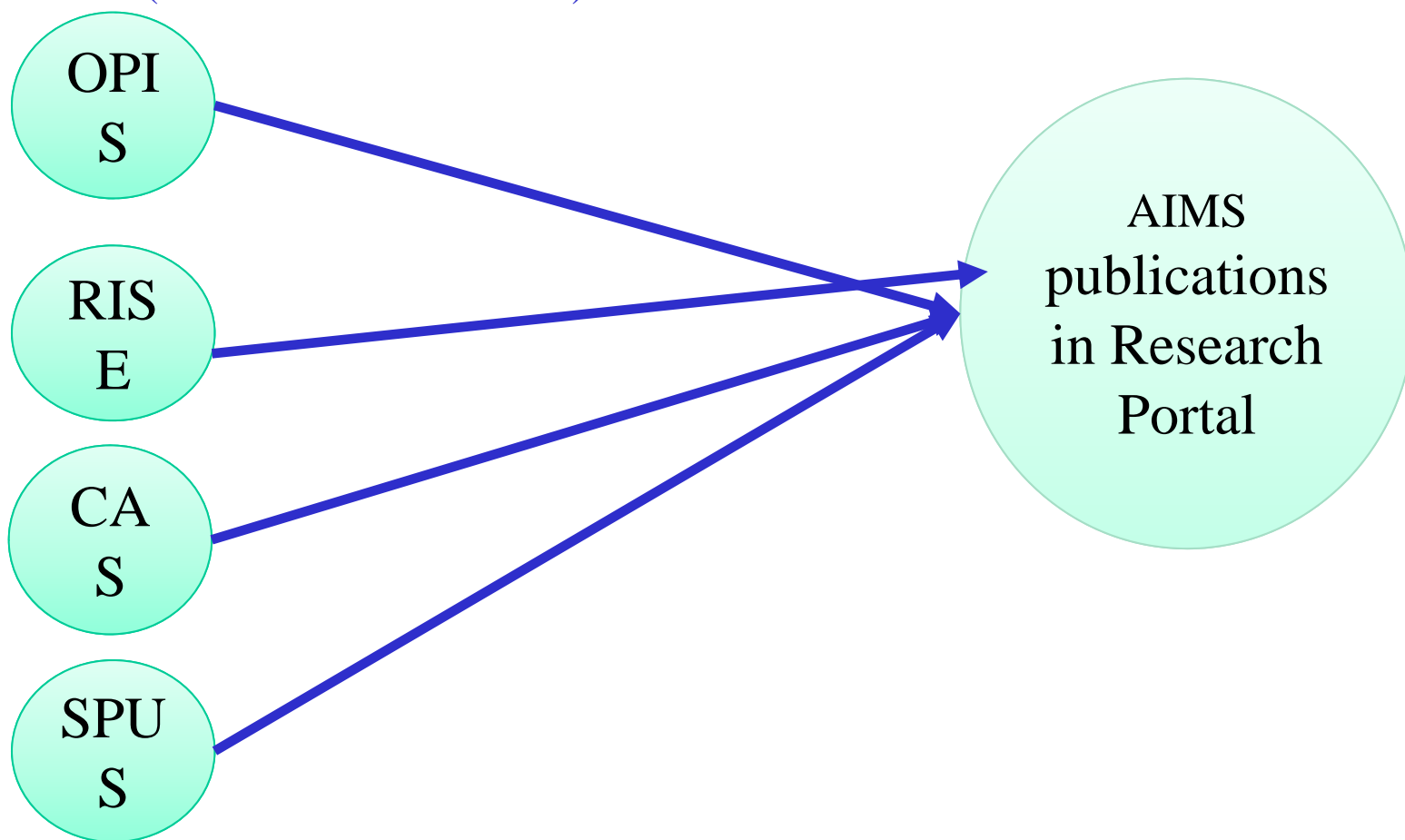

Research description

In late summer 1895, at the age of sixteen, Einstein sat the entrance examinations for the Swiss Federal Polytechnic in Zurich (later the Eidgenössische Polytechnische Schule). He failed to reach the required standard in several subjects, but obtained exceptional grades in physics and mathematics; He completed his primary and secondary studies to the Hochschule of Argovie in Switzerland, where he graduated on 30 September 1896. He has excellent results in mathematics, but refuses to educate itself in biology and social sciences, because he does not perceive the interest to learn disciplines which he considers already widely investigated. He then considers science as the product of human reason and reflection. He asks his father to give him the Swiss nationality to join his family emigrated to Milan in Italy. Einstein, though he was only seventeen, enrolled in the four-year mathematics and physics teaching diploma program at the ETH Zurich. He left the university in 1900 with a diploma as a teacher of mathematics and physics. He postulates many jobs without being accepted. He then was hired as a private tutor in Winterthur, Schaffhausen and finally in Bern. In 1901 his application for Swiss citizenship was granted. On 16 June 1902, Einstein finally got on the recommendation of his friend Marcel Grossmann, a permanent position at the patent office in Bern, as an assistant examiner. In 1905, he published articles on relativity, the quantum hypothesis of light and the theory of Brownian motion. He received his PhD January 15, 1906. In 1909, he was recognized by his peers, he was recognized as a leading scientist, and he was appointed lecturer at the University of Bern. He became a full professor at Karl-Ferdinand University in Prague in 1911. In 1913, he was appointed to the Prussian Academy of Sciences. In 1914, he moved to Germany and became a member of the Royal Academy of Sciences and Arts in Berlin. In 1916 he published a book presenting his theory of gravitation, known sources the name of the general relativity. In 1920, he traveled extensively throughout the world. He became the winner of the Copley Medal in 1925 and was named president of the League of Human Rights, and Franklin Medal winner in 1935. In 1933, he moved to the United States where he worked at the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton.

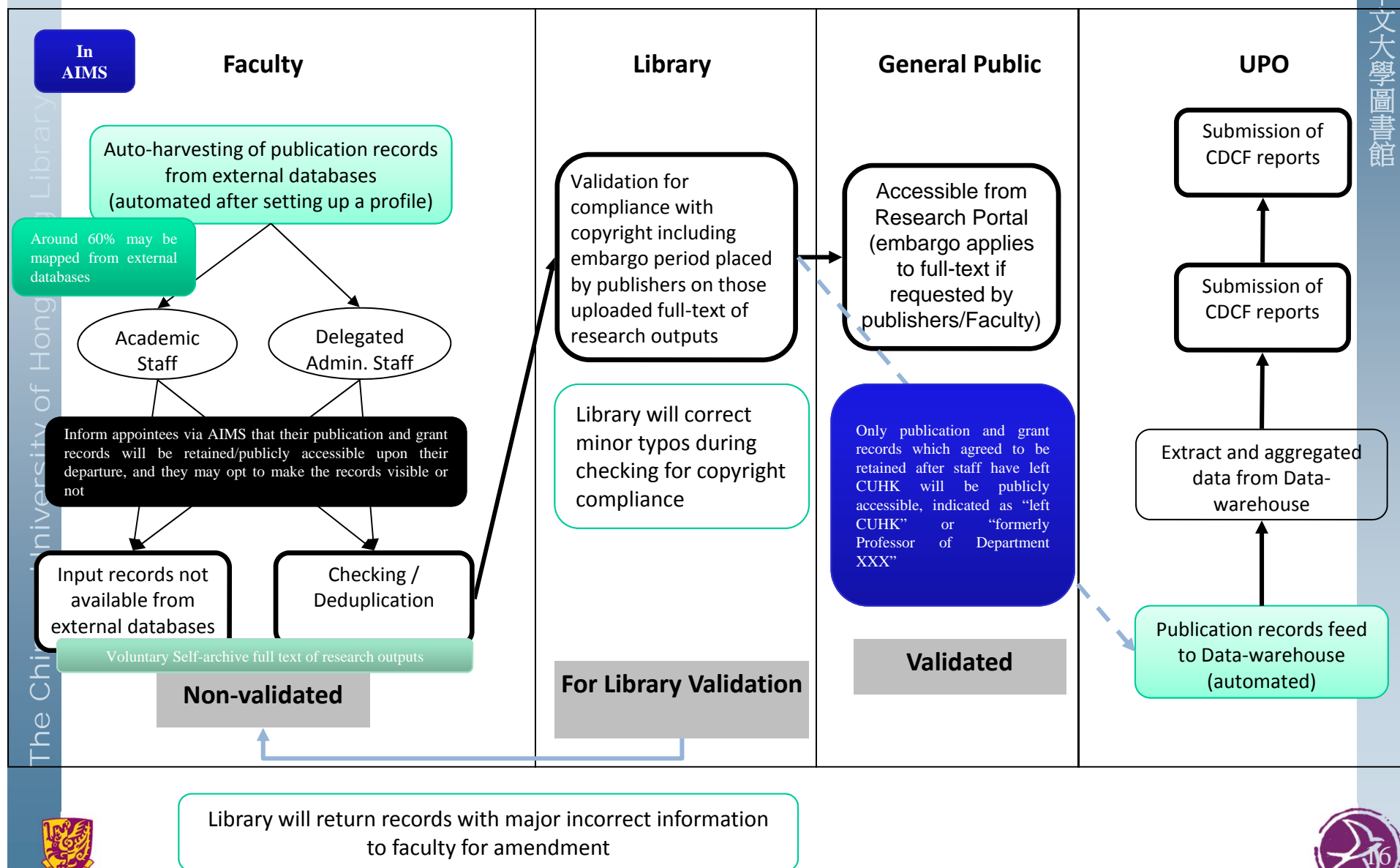

Copyright support

- Offers researcher assistance in checking copyright permissions, negotiating licensing terms that allow researchers to deposit published articles into repositories, requesting final manuscript versions from faculty
- Assist copyright clearance to make deposit easier for authors.
- Provides help pages and guides to aid authors with the decision of whether or not they could publish their materials in Open Access IRs without infringing any previous copyright releases they may have already signed.
- Advise on the use of alternative licenses such as Creative Commons, which implicates that the most important rights will be retained by the author:
 - the right to reuse an article to be included in a book
 - the right to share, rewrite and adapt an article
 - the right to copy your article for teaching purposes
- Includes clear terms of use in the Research Portal

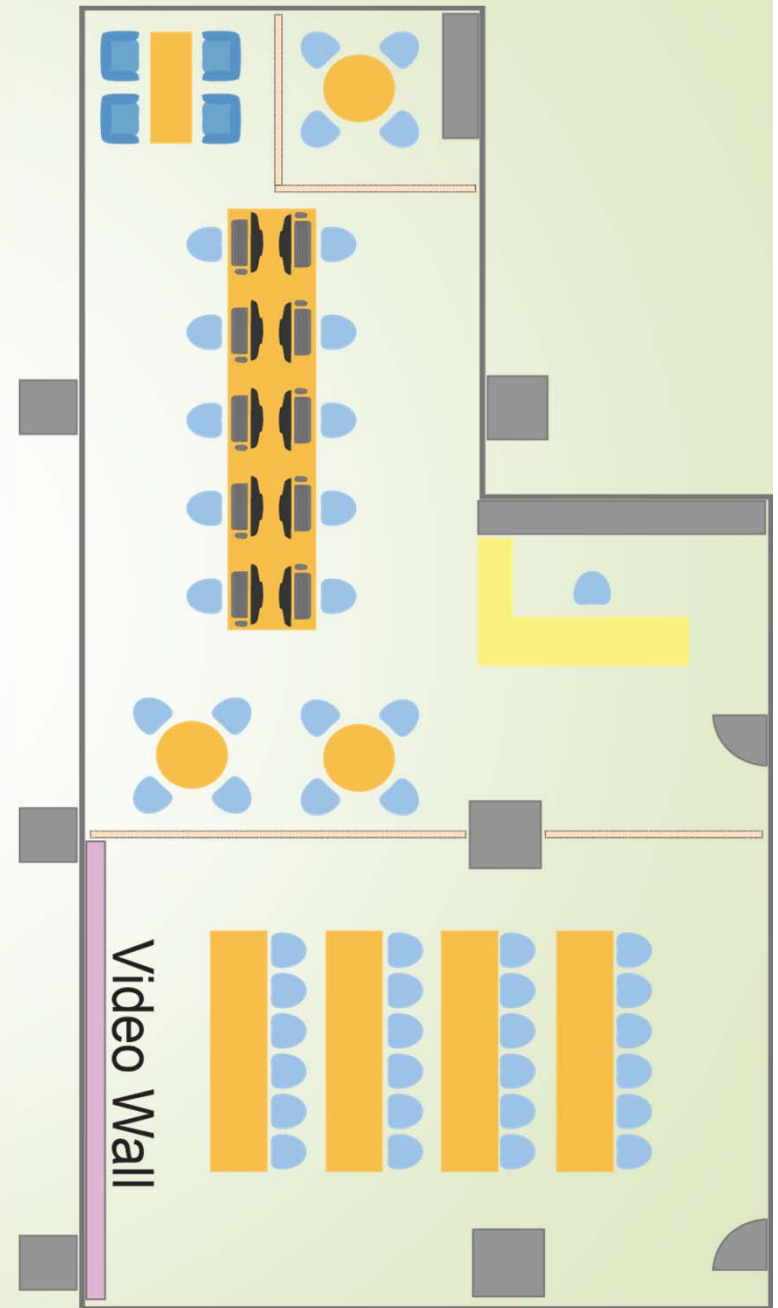

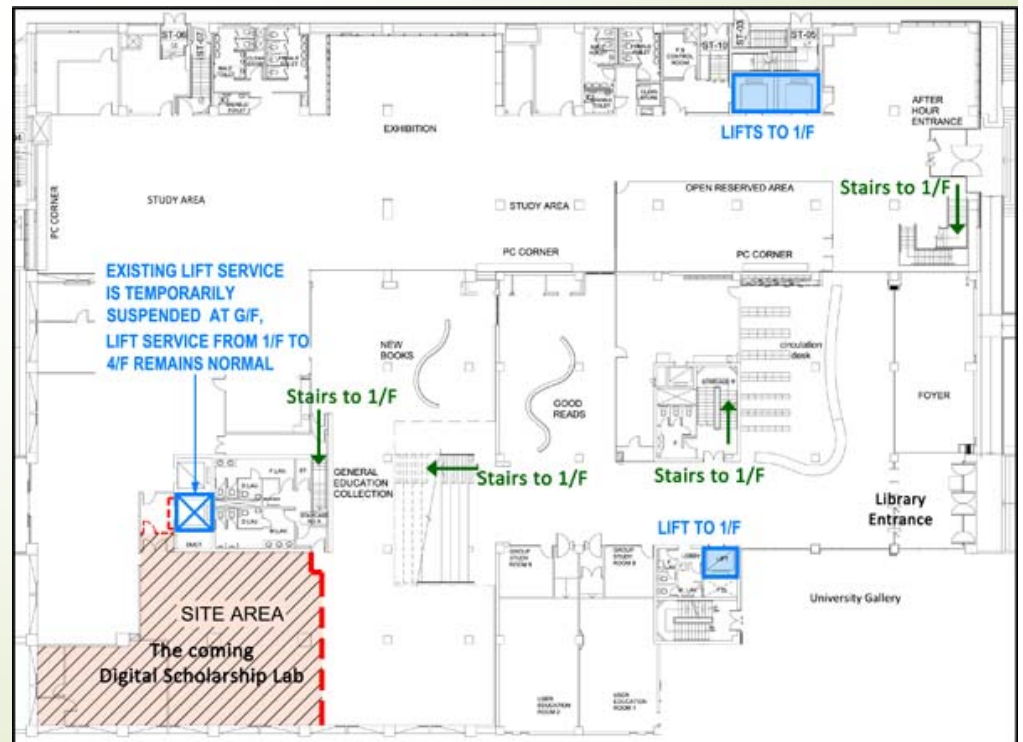

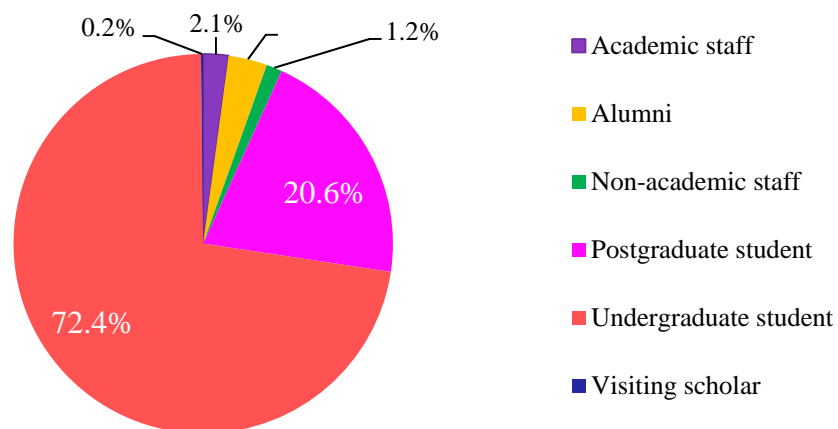

6.3 New Asia College Ch'ien Mu Library User Survey 2015

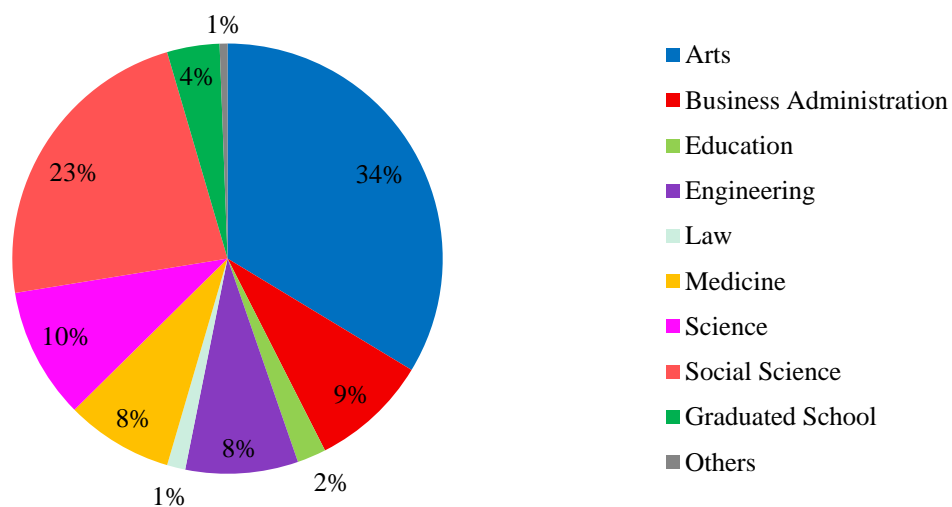

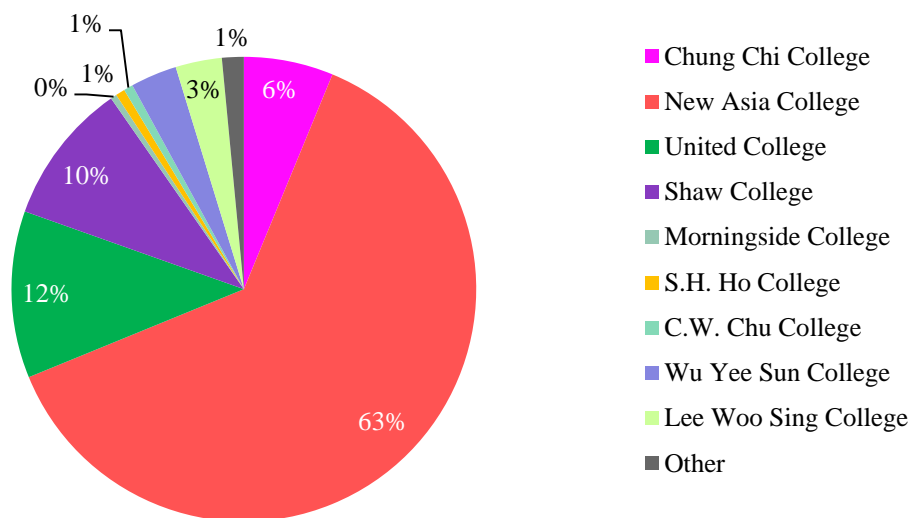
Q1: Which category can best describe you?



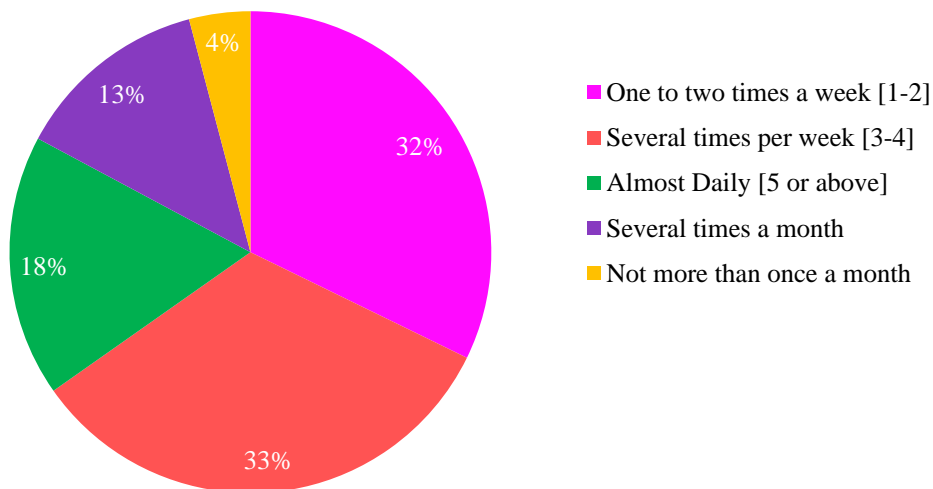
Q2: Which faculty do you belong to?



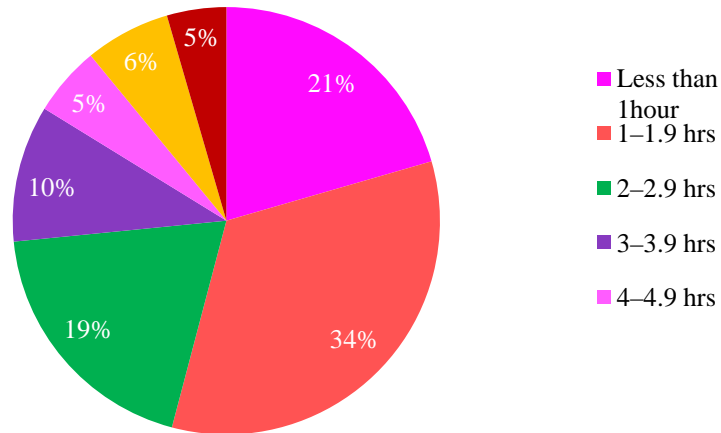
Q3: Which college do you belong to?



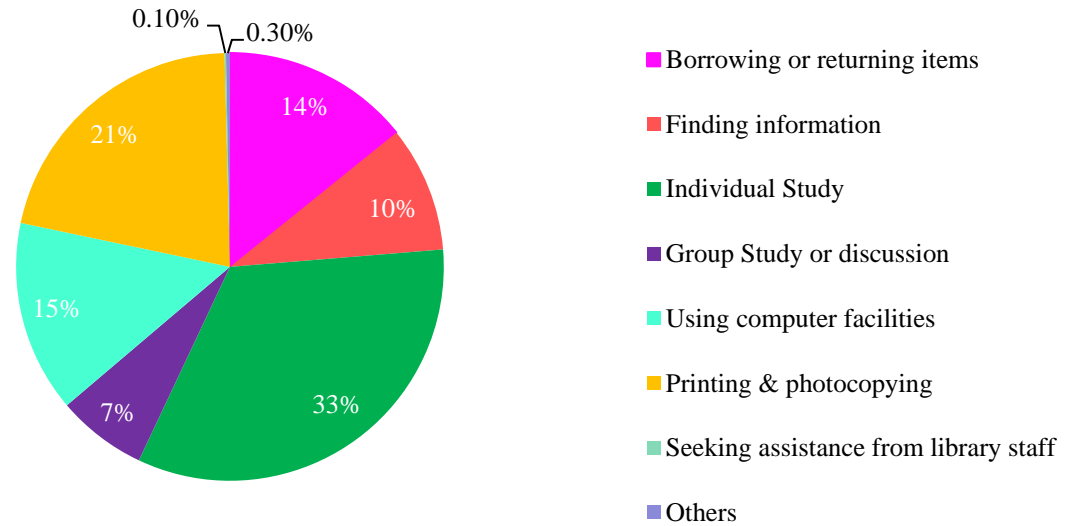
Q4: On average, how often do you use the Library?



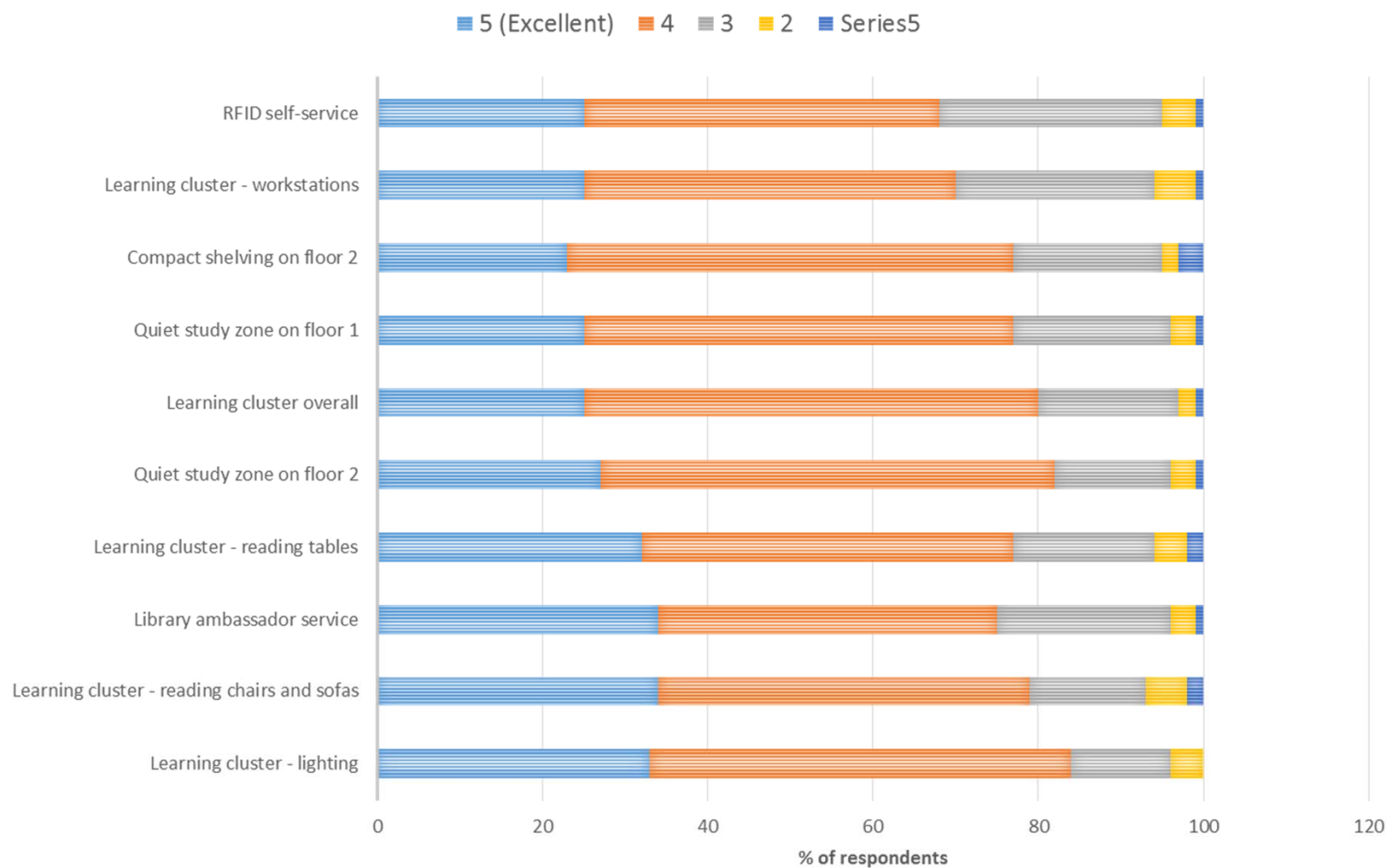
Q5: On average, how long do you stay in the Library each time?

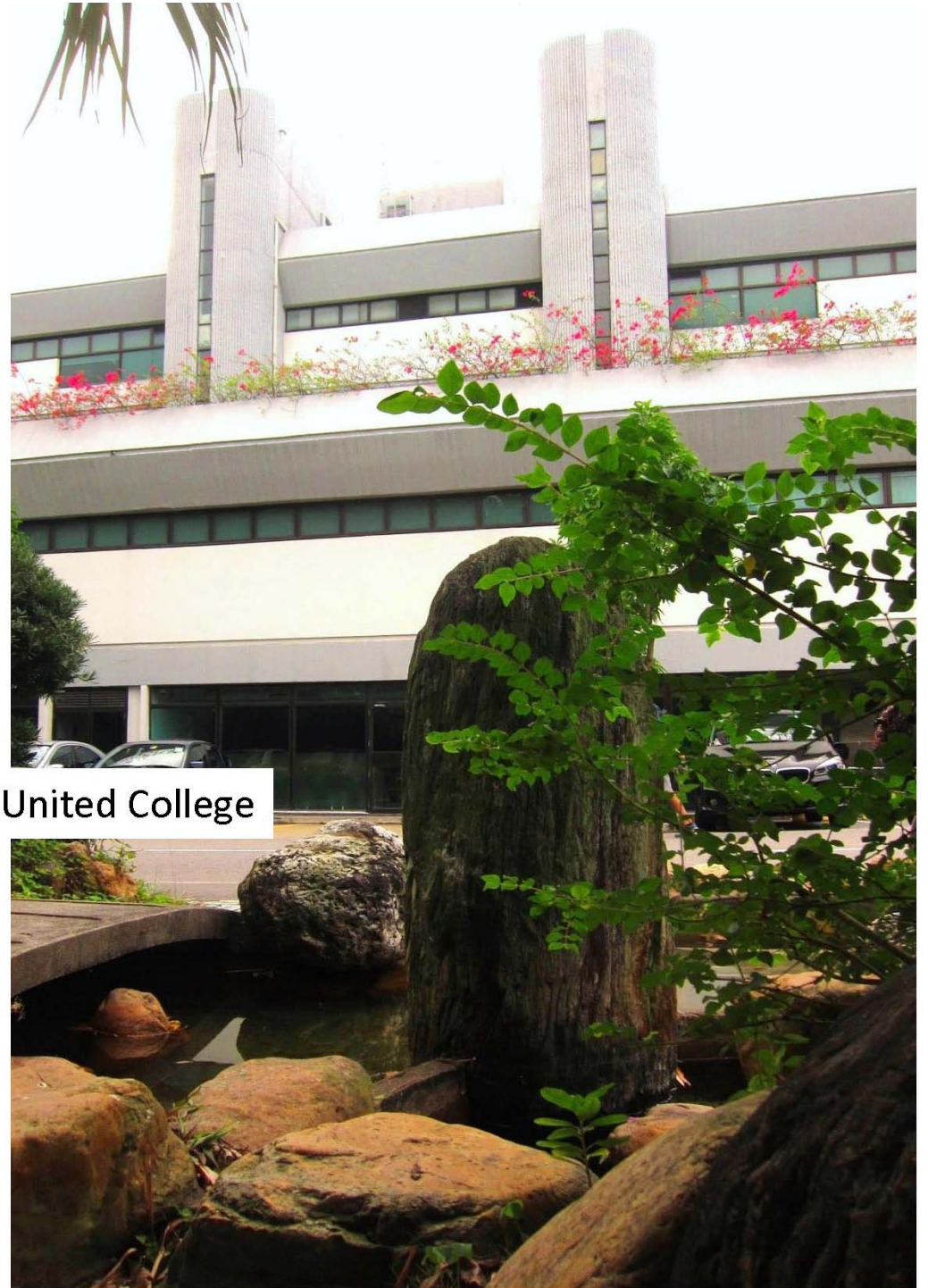
